**Notes to the financials results:**

- The Audited Standalone Financial Results were reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on 30th May, 2023. These audited financial results have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind-AS") as specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with rule 3 of the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (as amended from time to time) and the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.
- The results for the year ended 31st March, 2023 are audited by the Statutory Auditor of the Company, under regulation 33 of Securities & exchange Board of India (Listing obligation and disclosure requirements) regulation, 2015, as amended. An unqualified report was issued by them thereon.
- The Company has only one operating & reportable segment i.e. Education activities; during the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2023 therefore disclosures as required by Ind-As 108, 'Operating Segments' are not given.
- During the quarter ended 31st December 2022, the Company had allotted 43,61,885 equity shares of Rs. 1/- each under the Preferential allotment route to M/s. New Bonanza Impex Private Limited, a Promoter Group Entity. In view of the above, the holding of the Promoter / Promoter Group stands increased to 42.98 percent of the equity share capital of the Company.
- The figures of the previous year / period / quarter are regrouped / rearranged / reclassified, wherever necessary.
- The figures of the quarter ended March 31, 2023 and the corresponding quarter ended in the previous year as reported in this financial results are the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures upto the end of the third quarter of the relevant financial year.

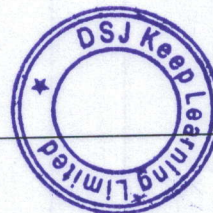

### Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone annual financial results of DSJ Keep Learning Limited (Formerly known as DSJ Communications Limited) ("the Company") for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023 (the "Statement") attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these annual financial results:

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition & measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the "Act") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023.

#### Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under Section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the 'Act'). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Management's Responsibilities for the Standalone Financial Results

These standalone annual financial results have been prepared on the basis of the standalone financial statements.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the standalone financial results, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors is also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

#### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the standalone financial results as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these standalone financial results.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the standalone financial results, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. 

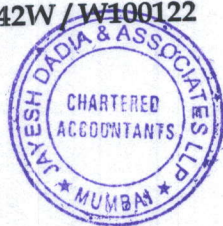

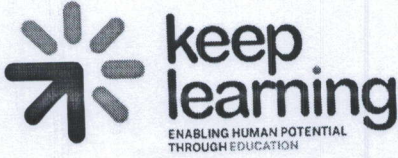
